
"Spring is Here"

President's Column

At the March 5th and March 27th meetings, the board discussed filling board vacancies, updates from the strategic planning process, and planning for next year's budget. These items will be presented and voted on at the Annual Congregational meeting on June 25th.

The Strategic Listening Sessions were successful and the strategic planning committee will be sending out an electronic follow-up survey shortly to

gather additional feedback and prioritize action items from these sessions. Key points to be drawn from the two Listening Sessions to date were CVUU's desire to increase visibility, increase membership, and increase revenue to pay a staff that would deliver more services to the church and community.

Due to travel and work schedules a strategic plan will not be completed by the June 25th Congregational meeting but any pointed items that still need discussion will be highlighted and discussed during this time, with a formal strategic plan to follow in the early fall.

CVUU earned a \$600 profit from the Orange Fundraiser, which is down from the profit of about \$1000 a year ago, and from the \$1500 that we budgeted. Additionally, we will not be doing a fundraising dinner that was in the budget and therefore, even with some additional pledges and unspent funds in other programs, we will likely come out \$700 in the red in June at the end of our fiscal year.

In April and May, the stewardship team (Jim Evans, Sandy Charlson, and Lorien Belton) will be holding cottage meetings to discuss what CVUU means to you and why you pledge.

We have received great feedback on an organizational chart/ task list and Susan Buffler is summarizing it in a chart form to be hung up at CVUU so that everyone knows who to contact about what and how to match their interests with the appropriate committee. Susan and Lorien have also drafted a formal building policy for how to determine what groups use the building at what cost. The board has yet to discuss it in its entirety but agreed to start passing a plate for non-paying building users to donate to CVUU as they see fit.

The board is still in search of a member to fill Todd Seeholzer's position. Additionally, at the end of June, Jay Black and Jenny Norton (interim) will be leaving the Board of Trustees. At least 3 board positions will be available starting July 1st. There is currently a vacancy on the Nominating Committee due to Doug Jackson-Smith moving.
