
This morning the sun rose in a flood of pink with sharp gray clouds. My little tree was stark and black against the vivid background.

COMMUNITY & CARING TEAM: TRYING SOMETHING NEW! A small group met after the Sunday service on February I Ith to talk about what to do about reviving the Membership Team. This is an important group that includes Fellowship & Hospitality as well as Caring for our members and friends in need.

Long-time CVUU member Leslie Black has been a stalwart member of this group over the years but this is too much work for just one or two people. Members Sandy Charlson and Jim Evans are contributing to Fellowship/Hospitality and Caring.

Our first topic of discussion was "what if we change the name?" People do not enter our doors seeking membership. They are looking for something, but it probably isn't membership so we decided to rename the 'Membership Team' to the "Community & Caring Team". We will announce more soon!

VOLUNTEER WITH THE COMMUNITY & CARING TASK FORCE: Help out with a 'first serve' one time "no strings attached" task to see if this is a fit for you. Below are a few tasks that are always needed.

OUT FRONT: Greet regular attendees and newcomers at the front door. Give newcomers a welcome packet and have them sign the guest book. Hand them an order of service and invite/direct them into the Sanctuary.

BEHIND THE SCENES: Add people to the Google Group Listserv and Access database. Sit in the back and take the Sunday service attendance.

FELLOWSHIP & HOSPITALITY: Help out with various social events such as Fellowship potlucks. Coordinate, setup and takedown/cleanup are tasks needed here.

CARING: Help coordinate meal deliveries, visits, and other needs of our CVUU community.

SUNDAY COFFEE BUYER NEEDED: We are looking for a coffee buying point person. Someone who is willing to occasionally check on what is needed, order the coffee from the Café lbis, pick it up and get it to the church.

Normally, 2x5lb bags (French roast) are pre-ordered; one goes in the tin in the cupboard under the kitchen island, the other in the freezer. We anticipate that this would only have to happen maybe every few months or so.
